¶ Every horse & pony placed 1st in all Inhand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. All Champions & Reserves will qualify for the Champion & Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line. ¶

All qualified horses and ponies will be listed on the Caledonian Showing Championship Show's website www.caledonianchampionships.webs.com ¶

This show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK) Affiliation No22-147

CHAPS UK Qualifying classes enable eligible exhibits to enter the relevant classes at the CHAPS (UK) Championship Show in the year relevant to qualification. Separate Finals will be held at the Championship Show for Yearlings; Two Year Olds, Three Year Olds and for Natives and Non Natives (Ridden and In-Hand), together with Ridden Finals for Lead Rein, First Ridden, Junior, Novice and Side Saddle sections and riding club finals.

Members should apply to CHAPS(UK) for appropriate qualifier card.

The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 10th – 13th August 2022.

Shows held after the 7th August 2022 will count as 2023 qualifiers.

Traditional Gypsy Cobs TGCA Championship Show Classes

This show is affiliated to Traditional Gypsy Cob Association Affiliation Number TGCA – 22/1106/3/ULT

No known breeding required to enter these classes. TGCA Breed classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed Finals at the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association's (TGCA) National Breed Championship Show “TOYS”.

Classes are open to all traditional gypsy cobs. Part Bred classes, are open to all part bred traditional gypsy cobs and are qualifiers for the part bred finals at “TOYS”.

The exhibit must have one parent that is bred traditional gypsy cob. Stallions – All stallions (four years and over) in order to enter any TGCA affiliated class MUST be TGCA registered, have passed TGCA stallion evaluations and their TGCA stallion disc displayed on their bridle. Stallions and colts over the age of two, MUST be shown in a stallion bridle with a metal bit and chain lead as per the current TGCA rulebook.

Current TGCA members must present their Membership card and Qualification card to the judge in the ring for signature. Non-members MUST receive a qualification card from the judge and have 21 days to join the TGCA and register their horse to validate the qualification. Please refer to www.tgca.co.uk for further details including membership, horse registration and showing rules (contained within the members handbook).

Championships Quest for a Star Championship - TGC - 1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA classes above may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship as per below rule. ONLY current TGCA members and horse/pony that is already TGCA registered can exhibit in this championship. Membership card and Member's qualification card (specific to that exhibit) must be presented upon entry into the ring. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS.

Go for Glory Championship - PB -1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA part bred classes may go forward to the Go for Glory Championship. For TOYS qualifiers, the handler/rider and exhibits (apart from stallions) do not have to be TGCA members/registered on the date of the show. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Crowning Glory Championships at TOYS

RING 1 – RIDDEN CLASSES -Commencing promptly at 8.30am

- CLASS 200** **RIDDEN MARE OR GELDING** for horses exceeding 14.2hh but not 15.2hh
- CLASS 201** **RIDDEN MARE OR GELDING** for horses exceeding 15.2hh
- CLASS 202** **RIDDEN COB**
- CLASS 203** **RIDING CLUB HORSE** Competitors will be judged on turnout of horse and rider and will be asked to do a short show including walk, trot and canter on both legs, and include a small jump. Horses must be ridden in a snaffle bit

OVERALL CHAMPIONSHIP – for 1st and 2nd places in classes 200-203
CHAMPION: Alloa Charity Show Perpetual Trophy and Rosettes
RESERVE: Special Rosette

RING 1 – Following ridden horse classes, but not before 11am

TACK & TURNOUT

To be judged on condition and turnout of the pony and rider, and not on conformation.

- CLASS 204** Lead Rein
CLASS 205 for riders 16 years or under
CLASS 206 for riders over 16 years

Please Note: Rider/Pony combination may only enter one class from 204-206

LEAD REIN PONY

For ponies not exceeding 14.2hh. Competitors required to walk and trot only

- CLASS 207** For riders 6 years old and under.
CLASS 208 For riders over 6 years old and under 12 years old.

CLASS 209 YOUNG HANDLER

Competitors date of birth must be stated on entry form. Competitors required to walk pony, turn and lift pony's front foot. For competitors age 16 years and under.

CLASS 210 FIRST RIDDEN

Open to ponies upto 14.2hh – child 12 years and under, no lead reins. Competitors required to walk and trot as a group, and canter if possible in individual.

CLASS 211 RIDDEN PONY

Open to ponies upto 14.2hh – no lead reins. Competitors required to walk, trot and canter in figure of 8.

CLASS 212 Pony Club Pony

Open to ponies upto 14.2hh – for 25 years and under, no lead reins. Competitors required to walk, trot as a group canter as a group and do one small jump.

This class may be split into large breeds and small breeds if numbers demand. Highland ponies may not enter this class. Best Shetland, to go forward to championship.

**CLASS 215 MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND - In Hand
Filly, Colt or Gelding, 3 Years Old and Under.**

This class may be split into large breeds and small breeds if numbers demand. Highland ponies may not enter this class. Best Shetland, to go forward to championship.

MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND – Ridden, 4 years and over

This class may be split into large breeds and small breeds if numbers demand. If split, large breeds will compete first. Competitors will be asked to walk, trot and canter, no lead reins please. Highland ponies may not enter this class. Best Shetland to go forward to championship.

Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However, in order to Qualify both Owner and Rider / Exhibitor need to be a current showing member and have a valid Qualification card.

Only Skewbalds/Piebalds may compete in these classes.

All stallions, 4 years old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS(UK).

All stallions must wear Stallion ID Discs in the ring without exception.

Not to exceed 148cm

Open to mares, stallions and geldings aged 4 years and over.
148cm and above

Quest for a Star Championship: Traditional Gypsy Cobs 1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA classes (225-228) above may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship as per below rule.

CHAMPION: Jumps for Fun Presentation Shield

***ONLY current TGCA members and horse/pony that is already TGCA registered can exhibit in this championship. Horses must be over the age of 4 for ridden classes.

for ponies under 153cms, Pony/rider combination not to have won more than one 1st in any WH Pony class. Height of jumps 60cms approx..

CLASS 242 NOVICE WORKING HUNTER PONY for ponies under 153cms
Pony/rider combination not to have won more than one 1st in any WH Pony class. Height of jumps 60cms approx.

CLASS 243 INTERMEDIATE WORKING HUNTER PONY for ponies under 153cms
Height of jumps 75cms approx.

CLASS 244 OPEN WORKING HUNTER PONY for ponies under 153 cms
Height of jumps 85cms approx.

CHAMPIONSHIP: for 1st and 2nd places in classes 241-244
CHAMPION: The Sundance Trophy

CLASS 245 NOVICE WORKING HUNTER HORSE

For horses 153cms and over. Height of jumps: 80cms approx.
Horse/rider combination not to have won more than one 1st in any WH class.

CLASS 246 INTERMEDIATE WORKING HUNTER HORSE

For horses 153cms and over. Height of jumps: 95cms approx.

CLASS 247 PERTH EQUINE VETS/BHS SCOTLAND WORKING HUNTER SERIES 2022

Jumps 3'6" approximately. For horses 148cm and over, 4 years old and over. Riders must be 18 years or over on the day of the competition. Class will be judged under "Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain" rules.

Blair Castle International Horse Trials and Country Fair Qualifier. The first three prize winners will qualify for the final of the Perth Equine Vets/BHS Scotland Working Hunter Series which will be held at Blair Castle in August 2023. To be eligible for the final either the rider or the owner must be a member of the British Horse Society.

**Note: A water tray may be included in the jumping course for this class.
Rosettes and final kindly sponsored by Botanica.**

Height of jumps in first round approximately 1m

**RULE: HORSE/PONY SHOULD NOT BE ENTERED INTO MORE THAN 2 CONSECUTIVE
SHOWJUMPING/WORKING HUNTER CLASSES.**

Ring 8 - Commencing at approximately 1.30pm – Pony Show Jumping

for genuine lead-rein riders only. Ponies 14.2hh and under. Very small fences!.
Competitors in this class cannot compete in any other showjumping class.
- CLASS 253 NURSERY NOVICE PONY**
Pony not to have won more than two 1sts in any show jumping competition.
Height of jumps in first round approximately 60cms.
- CLASS 254 NOVICE PONY**
Pony not to have won more than three 1sts in any show jumping competition.
Height of jumps in first round approximately 70cms
- CLASS 255 SMALL OPEN PONY**
Height of jumps in first round approximately 80cms
- CLASS 256 OPEN PONY**
Height of jumps in first round approximately 90cms

**RULES: HORSE/PONY SHOULD NOT BE ENTERED INTO MORE THAN 2 CONSECUTIVE
SHOWJUMPING/WORKING HUNTER CLASSES
NO SPURS SHOULD BE WORN IN PONY SJ CLASSES**

RULES

(Competitors must read these rules before submitting entries, and must agree to abide by them)

1. The decision of the judge in each class is final.
2. Showjumping classes will be held under BS rules where applicable.
3. Horses must be at least 4 years old for ridden classes.
4. Competitors must be correctly dressed both when competing and when walking the courses. A hat complying with British Standards recommendations must be worn at all times when mounted, including when competing in the Fancy Dress class.
5. Trainers may not be worn at any time when mounted!
6. Competitors must come into the ring mounted and correctly dressed for prize giving.
7. Complaints must be handed in at the Light Horse Section secretary's caravan in writing, with a £15 deposit, immediately upon conclusion of the relevant class. The deposit will be returned if the complaint is upheld.
8. Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times.
9. The committee of Stirling Agricultural Show Light Horse section reserves the right to refuse entries.
10. No refunds for classes withdrawn, classes may be swapped if numbers allow.
11. An extra £2 per class will be charged for entries on the day.
12. Horse/pony may not be entered into more than two consecutive Showjumping or Working Hunter Classes.



Remember: Entries close on 02 June 2023 for names to appear in the programme. After that date entries will be taken on a "first come first served" basis, and entries on the day can only be guaranteed in show jumping classes. Entry to showing classes will only be taken if places are still available.
