The Clydesdale Horse Society Shield

A Shield (which will be supplied and engraved by The Clydesdale Horse Society) will be awarded to the best yearling or two-year-old colt or filly, registered or eligible for registration with the Society, not having won a Shield before in its lifetime. The exhibitor must be a current member of The Clydesdale Horse Society.

Young Handlers Class

An engraved medal is presented by The Clydesdale Horse Society to the best young handler aged 12 to 16 on the day of the show who has not already qualified. That person will also receive a Young Handler qualifier rosette on the day of the show. The capabilities of the handler are to be assessed, not the animal being led.

Qualifiers from any show held prior to 30th April in any year will qualify for the Young Handler final at the Royal Highland Show in the year of that show. Qualifier after 30th April in any year will qualify for Young Handler Final at the following year's Royal Highland Show. A merit rosette will be given to all entrants in the class. The Young Handler Scheme and The Young Handler Final are generously sponsored by the James Bennett Fund.

HEAVY HORSE TURNOUT

Class 160 Driven Heavy Horse of the Year Championship – HOYS Qualifier

The entry fee per animal in the turnout class will be £45.00 including the £20 HOYS Contribution Fee. There is a £10 appearance fee given out on the day.

This competition is open to mares and geldings that are Heavy Horses of draught type, four years old and over. Breeds to include, but not limited to Shires, Clydesdale, Percheron, Suffolk Punch and Belgian Draught.

All Drivers and Owners must be Members of either the Shire Horse Society, The Clydesdale Horse Society, The Suffolk Horse Society, British Percheron Horse Society or The Showing Register.

Single Horse to be driven in a two wheeled show cart, Drivers to have obtained their 18th birthday by the 1st of January in the current year.

This class will run in accordance with the Horse of the Year Show Rulebook.

Additional Rules:

- Qualification will not pass below 5th place.
- Horses must be entered in the name and ownership they are registered.
- To be driven in chrome harness and peak collars or English harness to suit the cart, brass harness and short top collars allowed.
- Carts must only be two wheeled and single driven.
- This is not a turnout class; aprons, spares and lamps are not required.

RIDDEN Clydesdale

Class 161 The Barber Family Ridden Heavy Horse of the Year – HOYS Qualifier

The entry fee per animal in the ridden class will be £45.00 including the £20 HOYS Contribution Fee. There is a £10 appearance fee given out on the day.

This competition is open to purebred mares, geldings and stallions 4 years old and over **that are registered in, and comply with showing requirements of the Shire, Clydesdale, Suffolk or British Percheron Society Stud Books, at the time of qualification.** Partbreds are not eligible to compete.

All Riders and Owners must be Members of either the Shire Horse Society, The Clydesdale Horse Society, The Suffolk Horse Society or British Percheron Horse Society.

These classes will be run in accordance with the general show rules as set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.hoys.co.uk

Additional Rules:

- Qualification will not pass below 5th place.
- Horses will be required to gallop at the final.
- Riders of stallions must have obtained their 16th Birthday before 1st January in the current year.
- **Rider turnout should be traditional, with evening attire required for championships as appropriate.**
- Horses must be entered in the name and ownership they are registered.
- Horses should be turned out in a traditional manner as per their breed society rules, **tail plaits including wool are optional**, flights/standings are not permitted.
- For Clydesdale horses, they are to hold a Clydesdale Horse Society passport with full pedigree details, stallions and mares are to appear in the main section of the Clydesdale Horse stud book. Geldings are to have appeared as produce of their dam if they have not been issued with a Clydesdale Horse Society Passport.
- **Horse Turnout: Plain noseband and browband with snaffle or traditional double or pelham bit. No bitless bridles, running gags or Liverpool bits are permitted.**
- **If shod, only normal shaped shoes that do not cover the frog are permissible. Shoes must be fitted to the circumference of the foot and give maximum support at the heels.**

Class 162 Scone Palace Ridden Clydesdale Qualifier

The entry fee per animal in the ridden class will be £25.00. There is a £10 appearance fee given out on the day.

This class is a qualifier for the Ridden Clydesdale Championship to be held at Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Thursday 27 August 2026. The first two CLYDESDALES to qualify. Qualification may go down to fourth place, if horses placed 1st and 2nd have previously qualified. Registered Clydesdales and those eligible for registration may qualify and enter for the Championship.
