Caledonian Showing Championships

This show is a qualifier for the Caledonian Showing Championships, which is now fully established as the biggest and best way to end Scottish showing season

This year's show will be held at

Howe EC, near Ladybank, Fife on 16/17/18 October 2026

Every horse & pony placed 1st in all Inhand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. All Champions & Reserves will qualify for the Champion & Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line.

All qualified horses and ponies will be listed on the Puddledub Show's Facebook page and <https://puddledub.entrymaster.online/>

RING 1 – RIDDEN CLASSES -Commencing promptly at 8.30am

- CLASS 200** **RIDDEN MARE OR GELDING** for horses exceeding 14.2hh but not 15.2hh
- CLASS 201** **RIDDEN MARE OR GELDING** for horses exceeding 15.2hh
- CLASS 202** **RIDDEN COB**
- CLASS 203** **RIDING CLUB HORSE** Competitors will be judged on turnout of horse and rider and will be asked to do a short show including walk, trot and canter on both legs, and include a small jump. Horses must be ridden in a snaffle bit

OVERALL CHAMPIONSHIP – for 1st and 2nd places in classes 200-203
CHAMPION: Alloa Charity Show Perpetual Trophy and Rosettes
RESERVE: Special Rosette

RING 1 – Following ridden horse classes, but not before 11am

TACK & TURNOUT

To be judged on condition and turnout of the pony and rider, and not on conformation.

- CLASS 204** Lead Rein
CLASS 205 for riders 16 years or under
CLASS 206 for riders over 16 years

Please Note: Rider/Pony combination may only enter one class from 204-206

LEAD REIN PONY

For ponies not exceeding 14.2hh. Competitors required to walk and trot only

- CLASS 207** For riders 6 years old and under.
CLASS 208 For riders over 6 years old and under 12 years old.

CLASS 209 YOUNG HANDLER

Competitors date of birth must be stated on entry form. Competitors required to walk pony, turn and lift pony's front foot. For competitors age 16 years and under.

CLASS 210 FIRST RIDDEN

Open to ponies upto 14.2hh – child 12 years and under, no lead reins. Competitors required to walk and trot as a group, and canter if possible in individual.

CLASS 211 RIDDEN PONY

Open to ponies upto 14.2hh – no lead reins. Competitors required to walk, trot and canter in figure of 8.

CLASS 212 Pony Club Pony

Open to ponies upto 14.2hh – for 25 years and under, no lead reins. Competitors required to walk, trot as a group canter as a group and do one small jump.

OVERALL CHAMPIONSHIP – for 1st and 2nd places in classes 207-212
CHAMPION: Donald Drysdale Memorial Trophy
RESERVE: Special Rosette

RING 2 - MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND (including Shetland and Highland Ponies) – Commencing promptly at 9.00am

**MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND - In – Hand
Stallion, Mare or Gelding, 4 Years Old and Over.**

This class may be split into large breeds and small breeds if numbers demand. Best Shetland and Highland, to go forward to championship.

**CLASS 213. Large Breed
CLASS 214 Small Breed**

**CLASS 215 MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND - In Hand
Filly, Colt or Gelding, 3 Years Old and Under.**

This class may be split into large breeds and small breeds if numbers demand. Best Shetland and Highland, to go forward to championship.

MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND – Ridden, 4 years and over

This class may be split into large breeds and small breeds if numbers demand. If split, large breeds will compete first. Competitors will be asked to walk, trot and canter, no lead reins please. Best Shetland and Highland to go forward to championship.

RING 2 – TO FOLLOW M&M Classes, BUT NOT BEFORE 12 noon

CLASS 218 IN - HAND VETERAN HORSE / PONY 15 YEARS AND OVER
This class may be split by age if numbers demand.

CLASS 219 RIDDEN VETERAN HORSE / PONY 15 - 19 YEARS

CLASS 220 RIDDEN VETERAN HORSE / PONY 20 YEARS & OVER

CHAMPIONSHIP: for 1st and 2nd places in classes 218-220
CHAMPION: The Billy Allan Memorial Trophy

RING 3 – Coloured Horse/Pony commencing at 9am

Any Height, 1, 2 and 3 year olds
- CLASS: 222** **Youngstock In-Hand Non-Native**
Any Height, 1, 2 and 3 year olds
- CLASS: 223** **In-Hand Native**
Mares, Geldings & Stallions, 4yo & over Any Height
- CLASS: 224** **In- Hand Non-Native**
Mares, Geldings & Stallions, 4yo & over Any Height
- CLASS: 225** **Ridden Native**
Mares, Geldings & Stallions, 4yo & over Any Height
- CLASS: 226** **Ridden Non-Native**

- CLASS 229** **RIDDEN HUNTER 4 years and over, not exceeding 153cm**
- CLASS 230** **RIDDEN HUNTER 4 years and over exceeding 153cm**

CHAMPIONSHIP: for 1st and 2nd place in class 232-235
CHAMPION: The Lynnbank Perpetual Trophy

RING 4 – NOT BEFORE 1.00PM **ROR - Retraining of Race Horse**

Any knocks, bumps, scars etc are to be ignored.
Boots are allowed and any tack is permitted except gadgets.
Horse is judged on condition and musculature.
Horse is also judged on it's general way of going and adaptability to it's new career.
Horses must be over the age of 4 for ridden classes.

- CLASS 231** **EX-RACEHORSES – IN HAND**
- CLASS 232** **EX-RACEHORSES – RIDDEN**

CHAMPIONSHIP: for 1st and 2nd places in classes 239-240
CHAMPION: McAlpine Trophy and Rosette

RING 5 – Warm-up Ring Flat

RING 6 – Warm-up Ring Jumping

RING 7 – Working Hunter - Commencing promptly at 8.30am

Please note: Working Hunter Ponies must be under 153cms and Working Hunter Horses must be 153cm or over

All classes will be judged on jumping ability, manners and ride/show

CLASS 233 LEAD REIN/FIRST RIDDEN WORKING HUNTER PONY

for ponies under 153cms, Pony/rider combination not to have won more than one 1st in any WH Pony class. Height of jumps 30cms approx..

CLASS 234 NOVICE WORKING HUNTER PONY for ponies under 153cms

Height of jumps 60cms approx.

CLASS 235 INTERMEDIATE WORKING HUNTER PONY for ponies under 153cms

Height of jumps 75cms approx.

CLASS 236 OPEN WORKING HUNTER PONY for ponies under 153 cms

Height of jumps 85cms approx.

CHAMPIONSHIP: for 1st and 2nd places in classes 241-244

CHAMPION: The Sundance Trophy

CLASS 237 NOVICE WORKING HUNTER HORSE

For horses 153cms and over. Height of jumps: 70cms approx.
Horse/rider combination not to have won more than one 1st in any WH class.

CLASS 238 INTERMEDIATE WORKING HUNTER HORSE

For horses 153cms and over. Height of jumps: 80cms approx.

CLASS 239 OPEN WORKING HUNTER HORSE

For horses 153cms and over. Height of jumps: 90cms approx.

OVERALL CHAMPIONSHIP - for 1st & 2nd places in classes 245-247

CHAMPION : *The H. Fergusson Trophy & Rosette*

RESERVE CHAMPION : *Special Rosette*

RULE: HORSE/PONY SHOULD NOT BE ENTERED INTO MORE THAN 2 CONSECUTIVE SHOWJUMPING/WORKING HUNTER CLASSES.

Ring 8 - Commencing 9am – Arena Event

CLASS 240	CROSS-POLES
CLASS 241	60CM
CLASS 242	70CM
CLASS 243	80CM
CLASS 244	90CM
CLASS 245	1M

RULE: HORSE/PONY SHOULD NOT BE ENTERED INTO MORE THAN 2 ARENA EVENT CLASSES.

Prize money will be paid for each

Arena Event Rules:

Cross country compliant kit should be worn including skull caps and body protectors.

Stop watches are not permitted.

Horses/ponies must be aged 4 and over.

Competitors will jump a course of showjumps followed by a course of xc style fences.

The winner will be the competitor with the lowest number of penalties.

In the event of a tie, the winner will be the one closest to the optimum time.

Judges decision is final.

SJ Phase

Knocking down obstacle	4 penalties
Knocking down bogey fence (if applicable)	6 penalties
First disobedience of horse in whole course	4 penalties
Second disobedience of horse in whole course	8 penalties
Third disobedience of horse in whole course	Elimination
(each circle or crossing tracks between fences counts as one disobedience)	
First fall of rider	Elimination
Fall of horse	Elimination
Error of course not rectified	Elimination
Failure to start or jump next fence within 60 seconds	Elimination
Starting before the bell	Elimination
Continuing the course without a hat, or with chinstrap undone	Elimination
Competitors eliminated in the phase may not proceed to the XC phase	

XC Phase

Knocking down an obstacle	4 penalties
First refusal, runout or circle of horse at obstacle	5 penalties
Second refusal, runout or circle of horse at obstacle	10 penalties
Third refusal, runout or circle of horse at obstacle	Elimination
Fall of rider	Elimination
Fall of horse	Elimination
Error of course not rectified	Elimination
Horse trapped in obstacle	Elimination
Horse resisting rider for 60 consecutive seconds anywhere on course	Elimination
Failure to cross finish line mounted	Elimination
Exceeding the time limit	Elimination
For every commenced second in excess of optimum time	0.4 penalty
Every commenced second in excess of 5 seconds under optimum time	0.4 penalty
Time limit twice optimum time	

RULES

(Competitors must read these rules before submitting entries,
and must agree to abide by them)

1. The decision of the judge in each class is final.
2. Showjumping classes will be held under BS rules where applicable.
3. Horses must be at least 4 years old for ridden classes.
4. Competitors must be correctly dressed both when competing and when walking the courses. A hat complying with British Standards recommendations must be worn at all times when mounted, including when competing in the Fancy Dress class.
5. Trainers may not be worn at any time when mounted!
6. Competitors must come into the ring mounted and correctly dressed for prize giving.
7. Complaints must be handed in at the Light Horse Section secretary's caravan in writing, with a £15 deposit, immediately upon conclusion of the relevant class. The deposit will be returned if the complaint is upheld.
8. Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times.
9. The committee of Stirling Agricultural Show Light Horse section reserves the right to refuse entries.
10. No refunds for classes withdrawn, classes may be swapped if numbers allow.
11. An extra £3 per class will be charged for entries on the day.
12. Horse/pony may not be entered into more than two consecutive Showjumping or Working Hunter Classes.



Remember: Entries close on 06 June 2025 for names to appear in the programme. After that date entries will be taken on a "first come first served" basis, and entries on the day can only be guaranteed in show jumping classes. Entry to showing classes will only be taken if places are still available.
